How To Look At Painting

"The Red Period" by Kosso Miller is a series of square red, yellow & black digital paintings (2048 x 2048 px each) made on iPad. The tactile quality of Kosso Miller's paintings asks to augment the limited contemporary sensorial physical field of painting into the new reality of the digitized gaze. Through a meticulous layering process the artist treats the screen as an abstract luminous surface. This dematerialistic process of adding and removing, filling and concealing, extends the poetic dimension of "The Red Period": floating substances (shapes, fields of color) are about to crystallize into beings.
